THE ORGANIZATION OF WOMEN IN INTERNATIONAL TRADE APPLAUDS RECIPIENTS OF ITS ANNUAL AWARDS FOR 2014

WASHINGTON, D.C. (January 30, 2015) – The Organization of Women in International Trade (“OWIT”) is pleased to announce selection of Ms. Alma Farias as the 2014 Woman of the Year, Ms. Beatrice Kagandu as the 2014 Chapter Member of the Year, and OWIT-Ottawa as the 2014 Chapter of the Year.

2014 Woman of the Year – Ms. Alma Farias, Ontario Representative for TFO Canada

Alma is a senior international business consultant that assists companies and organizations develop business by identifying key business partners and projects in Canada and Emerging Economy Countries. She provides customized assistance across a wide range of industries that includes auto parts, aerospace, manufacturing industry, telecommunications, agrifood, textile and consumer products among others. Alma has developed key government, association, and investor relations, as well as international sales and supply networks around the world. She has organized international delegations, conferences, and trade missions in Canada and Latin America. Alma is the Ontario Representative for Trade Facilitation Office (TFO) Canada, an organization that promotes trade between Canada and emerging economy countries. An active volunteer in numerous business associations, Alma has been a longstanding active OWIT member, serving on both local chapter and the international boards. In recognition of her longstanding contributions to the field of international trade and business, in February 2014, Alma received OWIT Toronto’s Joanna Townsend Excellence Award for Leadership in International Trade.

In addition to owning and operating her bakery, Sweet Inspirations, Beatrice Kagandu has tirelessly served OWIT Nairobi as its Vice Chairperson of Membership. 2014 OWIT Chapter of the Year – OWIT-Ottawa, Vice President of Outreach – Ms. Monica Podgorny

Founded in 2010, OWIT-Ottawa has established itself as a recognized leader in international trade in Canada's national capital region.
