Award of Excellence Reception: Promoting Diversity in Trade Law

The Ontario Bar Association (OBA) organized a keynote address and panel discussion in October with this year's recipient of the OBA Award of Excellence in International Law, Ms.

Valerie Hughes, and other leading practitioners highlighting the challenges and opportunities in promoting diversity in trade law.

Valerie is a WTO expert who runs a practicum program at Queen's University in which students advise organizations pro bono on opportunities under international trade agreements and public procurement and conduct other legal and policy research projects with a focus on promoting diversity in trade.

Despite ever-increasing evidence that the economic empowerment of women and people of diverse backgrounds facilitates sustainable economic development and yields greater productivity and economic growth, women and minority entrepreneurs continue to face disproportionally complex barriers to accessing economic opportunities. An interesting panel discussion took place with Valerie, Patricia Goff and Fernando Acuña..

Bennett Jones has been a partner of OWIT for years, and it was thanks to the connection with our OWIT Director, Carolina Soto, Assistant Trade Commissioner of Chile in Canada, that discussion of the Canada-Chile FTA gender and trade chapter was included in the panel discussion. The trade and gender chapter in the modernized Canada-Chile Free Trade Agreement (FTA) is an archetypal example of how state governments are starting to prioritize diversity initiatives in trade agreements.

First Canadian Women-only Business Mission to South Korea



As a result of the success achieved by the first women-only trade mission to Japan that the Asia Pacific Foundation Canada led this past April, four more women-only business missions to other key markets in Asia are being organized, supported by the federal government

South Korea as the next destination because it is the only country in Asia with which Canada has a bilateral FTA. The First Canadian Women-only Business Mission to Korea will be from February 27-29, 2020.

The mission will include a two-day visit to Seoul (one day for a conference to compare notes on broader gender policies including gender economic advancement initiatives in our two countries and one day for business to business meetings) followed by a day visit to a city outside of Seoul where delegates can observe some of Korea's smart city innovations in action.

Women's Roundtable Provides Insights into French Market



OWIT-Toronto participated in a lively roundtable discussion organized by Global Affairs Canada with Ambassador Isabelle Hudon, the first female Canadian Ambassador to France. She outlined opportunities for Canadian exporters in the French market with a population of 67 million and noted that "love capital for Canadian businesses is huge in France", emphasizing there is a growing appetite to learn more about Ontario.

Other topics discussed included Canada's free trade agreement with the EU, <u>CETA</u>, trade missions for women (one upcoming to <u>Paris and Brussels</u> the end of January) and <u>CanExport funding</u>, with attendees sharing their experiences and perspectives.

Among the Ambassador's tips for ensuring success: Invest time to get to know potential partners and understand the culture Access the Trade Commissioner Service for market knowledge and to help introduce you to partners Be very confident in your dealings but don't focus on your gender.

On January 1, 2020, the updated International Chamber of Commerce Incoterms® will come into effect. The World Trade Centre Toronto, in partnership with FITT and the Canadian Chamber of Commerce, is offering the only ICC-recognized Incoterms 2020 training course on December 4 in Toronto. It is designed to help businesses gain an understanding of the new rules and avoid business disruption.

Since non compliance with the new rules can lead to supply chain disruptions and increased costs, Canadian businesses that deal in the movement of goods, trade finance or trade contracts are encouraged to attend this training.
