The past year was a busy one for OWIT-Toronto's Trade Policy Committee which provided input and submissions to the Government of Canada on a possible Canada-Indonesia Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA), possible Canada Ukraine free trade agreement (FTA) modernization, possible accession to the Digital Economy Partnership Agreement, Canada-UK FTA and UK's Possible Accession to the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP), GBA+ (Gender Based Analysis) of Canada-Ukraine FTA, and GBA+ of Canada-Indonesia CEPA. Thanks to Co- Chair Maria Marchyshyn for taking the lead on the majority of submissions.

Cross-Borders' Virtual Event Attracts Large Audience



The OWIT chapters in the CUSMA/USMCA/T-MEC region - Ottawa, Toronto, Orange County, Los Angeles, and Mexico - and the Los Angeles Small Business Development Center Global teamed up for a collaborative online event on April 5 that attracted over 300 registrants from around the world. It was the first of a series of virtual events on the topic of recovery and resilience in the trade community that highlight the voices of women in trade. the first virtual frade Mission to Africa for women entrepreneurs in renewable energy and the ICT sectors, led by Global Affairs Canada (GAC) and the Canada-Africa Chamber of Commerce. A delegation of 20 Canadian womenowned and women-led companies networked and discussed business opportunities with decision makers and government officials from Botswana, Senegal, South Africa, and Cote d'Ivoire. Our chapter promoted the trade mission to OWIT chapters in Africa, and VP International Susan Baka presented an overview of OWIT activities in Canada and Africa during the training session. Empowering Women: Celebrating Women in Business and International Trade



OWIT Toronto in collaboration with OWIT Ottawa celebrated International Women's Day on March 10, 2022, through featuring both chapters' members in a panel discussion followed by a virtual networking session. The panelists addressed the barriers and challenges that women are facing in the international trade industry. Karima-Catherine Goundiam and Carole-Anne Nadeau shared how they managed to gain entry into markets like Mexico, MENA, and Africa that women haven't generally made inroads into. Anita Agrawal talked about how she has managed to break the stereotype that only men are suited for manufacturing and what she envisions for women in the manufacturing sector as well as in global trade. Tamaïka Jumelle advised on the partners that are essential to the ecosystem when exporting and growing internationally. Following the panel discussion, attendees and panelists broke into networking sessions, based on the industry – including service-based and product-based breakout rooms – where they shared their success stories and challenges in each sector and made connections with members of both OWIT chapters.
