CUSMA Passes Both House of Commons & Senate

Legislation implementing CUSMA - the new North American trade agreement - received royal assent in March. Its passage was expedited before Parliament was suspended due to the coronavirus outbreak. Bill C-4 was introduced in January after Canada, the U.S. and Mexico agreed to amendments to the agreement prompted by demands from U.S. House Democrats. The last-minute changes relate to environment and labour provisions.

OWIT-Toronto Provides CUFTA Submission

In February, the Government of Canada launched public consultations to seek the views of Canadians on the possible modernization of the Canada-Ukraine Free Trade Agreement (CUFTA). The focus of these consultations is to seek feedback on new areas that could be included in a modernized CUFTA, such as chapters on trade in services, trade and gender, investment, and SMEs, as well as potential updates to existing chapters in order to bring the Agreement up-to-date with Canada's most recent agreements. OWIT-Toronto was invited to make a submission, which was completed in March by Maria Marchyshyn, Advisor to the Board, and Susan Baka, VP International, on behalf of OWIT-Toronto.
